## Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriation Act (CRRSAA), Student Emergency Assistance Awards -

January - March, 2021 Report

Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) to provide emergency financial aid awards to students. As a recipient of CARES Act funding, the CARES Certification and Agreement authorized by Hamline's President Miller in May 2020 continues to serve as the assurance that the institution is using the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA for emergency financial aid awards to students.

As of March 31, 2021, the total number of students a

t Hamline University who were determined

to meet the institution's standards for eligibility to receive a CRRSAA emergency financial award was determined to be 2,825. As of March 31, 2021, the last day of the first quarter of 2021, the distribution of emergency financial aid assistance to students was in process but no awards had yet been distributed. Hamline has followed federal guidelines in determining which students were eligible to receive an award and award amounts, and has prioritized students with "exceptional need." The Office of Financial Aid developed lists of students who met Hamline University's definition of students with exceptional need, including undergraduate students who were Pell grant eligible. Grant award amounts were set in a consistent manner based upon each applicant's AY2021 expected family contribution and enrollment percentage.

The following table presents the anticipated expected family contribution (EFC) category ranges, anticipated number of students in each range to receive a CRRSAA emergency assistance award, and the award amounts.
